Baxter County Courthouse	#1 E. 7 th St., Courthouse Square Mountain Home, AR	1941-1943, structure built by Works Progress Administration (WPA). Listed in National Register of Historic Places on 05/26/1995.
Big Flat School Gymnasium	CR 121, So. Of Hwy. 17 Big Flat, AR	1938, structure built by National Youth Administration. Listed in National Register of Historic Places on 11/19/1993.
Big Spring / Bull Shoals	¼ mile SW of Powerhouse Road Bull Shoals, AR	c. 1973, spring with improvements constructed by the Green Thumb program. Listed in National Register of Historic Places on 05/05/2025.
Buford School Building	US Highway 126 Buford, AR	1936, Works Progress Administration (WPA)-built educational structure. Listed in National Register of Historic Places on 09/04/1992.
Case-Shiras-Dearmore House	351 E. 4 th Street Mountain Home, AR	1880, Plain Traditional style home linked to prominent local families. Listed in National Register of Historic Places on 02/03/1992.
Casey House	Casey House, Fairgrounds, Mountain Home, AR	c. 1858, dog-trot structure built by pioneer, soldier, & politician. Listed in National Register of Historic Places on 12/04/1975.
Cold Water School	242 CR 73 Big Flat, AR	1926, one-room rural school. Listed in National Register of Historic Places on 05/29/2008.
Cotter Bridge	US Hwy. 62 over White River Cotter, AR	1930, Marsh Rainbow-arch bridge. The Cotter Bridge is a National Historic Civil Engineering Landmark. Listed in National Register of Historic Places on 04/04/1990.
Cotter Water Tower	US 62 B and State Street Cotter, AR	1935, Public Works Administration--funded water tower. Listed in National Register of Historic Places on 01/24/2007.
Davis House	SE corner of Wolf St. & Hwy. 5 Norfolk, AR	1928, pyramid-roof cottage. Listed in National Register of Historic Places on 03/23/1995.
Domino Shed	9736 AR Hwy. 14 Big Flat, AR	c. 1972, pavilion built by the Green Thumb program. Listed in National Register of Historic Places on 01/13/2025.
Fort Smith to Jackson Road/Talbert's Ferry Segments	Restricted address	c. 1836, military road segments traversed by John Benge Detachment during Cherokee Trail of Tears. Listed in National Register of Historic Places on 09/22/2004.
Galatia Church	Hwy. 5 & Havner Road Norfolk, AR	c. 1900, Galatia Church West side of AR 5, north of the junction with Havner Road, Norfolk vicinity, Baxter County, one-room rural church. Listed in National Register of Historic Places on 09/08/2020.
Horace Mann School Historic District	City Hall Circle Norfolk, AR	1936, Works Progress Administration and National Youth Administration-built school complex. Listed in National Register of Historic Places on 01/29/2007.
Jacob Wolf House	Hwy. 5 South Norfolk, AR	c. 1825, two-story, dog-trot log home of pioneer leader. Listed in National Register of Historic Places on 04/13/1973.
Mountain Home Cemetery, Historic Section	147 E. 11 th Street Mountain Home, AR	1857- c. 1940, cemetery with excellent examples of nineteenth- and twentieth-century iconography. Listed in National Register of Historic Places on 02/13/2020.
Mountain Home Commercial Historic District	Bordered by 5 th Street, 9 th Street, South Street, & Hickory Street Downtown Mountain Home, AR	1892-1959, commercial center of the Baxter County seat of government. Listed in National Register of Historic Places on 06/15/2010.
Old Cotter High School Gymnasium	412 Powell Street Cotter, AR	1936-1938, structure built by Works Progress Administration (WPA). Listed in National Register of Historic Places on 09/29/1995.
Old Joe Site	Restricted location	c. 1500, rock art site. Listed in National Register of Historic Places on 05/04/1982.
Rollins Hospital	107 E. Main Street Gassville, AR	1923, community hospital building. Listed in National Register of Historic Places on 09/20/2007.
Sid Hutcheson Building	13912 Hwy. 5 South Norfolk, AR	1910, cast-concrete building that is important to the town's commercial history. Listed in National Register of Historic Places on 09/30/2014.
Uncle Willie Huffines Park	11812 AR Hwy. 14 Big Flat, AR	c. 1968-1972, park with several resources built by the Green Thumb program. Listed in National Register of Historic Places on 01/13/2025.
Wolf Cemetery	County Road 68 Norfolk, AR	1823-1904, cemetery of notable pioneer family. Listed in National Register of Historic Places on 03/13/2013.
